Rules of the Show

- The Redwood Empire Rose Society (RERS) Fall Rose Show is organized, staged, and judged in accordance with the rules of the American Rose Society (ARS) as set forth in the Guidelines and Rules for Judging Roses.
- Open to all rose growers regardless of residence. Only RERS members may check out perpetual trophies.
- Horticultural, Arrangement, Special Challenge, Classification and Placement committees Entries and Judges entries will be received 7:00 a.m. to 9:30 a.m. the morning of the show.
- All roses should be correctly named and exhibited under their approved ARS Exhibition Name (AEN).
- The variety must be listed in an ARS recognized publication. The Modern Roses online database should be used for the latest, and most accurate, information. Other publications which may be used are: ARS Official List of Approved Exhibition Names, the American Rose Annual, ARS Handbook for Selecting Roses, the list of "Recently Registered Roses" on the ARS website, and Combined Rose List.
- All show specimens must be entered by the exhibitor who has grown them in his/her outdoor garden, unless otherwise specified. Bush and Climbing Counterparts are shown in same class (HT, GF, FI, Min, Miniflora).
- ARS entry tags will be provided. Please fully complete, top, and bottom sections of Entry tags.
- When bringing your specimen to the Classification Table, please leave the entry tag unfolded so that it can be checked for completeness. This is to help the tally committee.
- Division I Specimens will be arranged alphabetically except Special Challenge, Unknown and Fragrant Rose.
- Wedges may be used but should not protrude above the lip of the container.
- RERS will provide some wedging material, or the exhibitor may bring his/her own. Dry Arrangement Foam Acceptable. (Do not use Styrofoam, it gets stuck in vases)
- Exhibitors may make more than one entry in horticultural classes, provided each entry is a different variety.
- Horticultural specimen containers will be provided, except where noted. Exhibitors requiring Rose-ina-bowl, wine glass, accessories should reserve them at the meeting preceding the show.
- Blue ribbon winners, that win best of section, are eligible for section certificates. *The decision of the Judges is final.*
- Awards will be presented at the Spring Dinner of RERS

- Colored stickers will be used in place of ribbons on entry tags.
- Any court of honor winner may request an ARS Certificate, if available. See the show chairman.
- Certificate winners wishing to have their awards presented to them at the Awards Dinner, give the tag, to the Awards Chairman prior to the Awards Dinner.
- Exhibitors wishing to retrieve horticultural specimens, arrangements, or containers, may do so at 4:00p.m. the day of the show.
- No exhibit may be removed before that time, except at the discretion of the show chairpersons.
- Old Garden Roses (OGRs) introduced before 1867, or of unknown date of origin, but known to have been in existence prior to 1867, will be listed in the ARS Handbook for Selecting Roses, with a double asterisk (**) before their names. OGRs introduced in 1867 or later, or of unknown date of origin, but known to have been in existence in 1867 or later, will be listed in the ARS Handbook for Selecting Roses as OGR, with no asterisks. For OGRs recommend the date of introduction be noted on the upper left corner of the entry tag. A dependable source of correct dates is the current Modern Roses. May be exhibited as one bloom – per stem or spray.
- The clean-up committee (all members) will dismantle the show promptly at 4:00 p.m., the day of the show. The RERS show committee will take reasonable precautions to ensure the safety of exhibits and properties.
- RERS and the Luther Burbank Art & Garden Center shall not be responsible for loss or damage to any property or personal injury.

Disqualifications for:

- Obvious enhancement of specimen and misnamed, unnamed or missing name on entry tag.
 Exhibitor's name visible, if not corrected before the entry is judged.
- A challenge class entry that does not satisfy the requirements of the class in which it is entered.
- Any entry that was not grown outdoors and/or not grown by the exhibitor.
- More than one entry of the same variety in the same class by the same exhibitor (if not moved by judges).

DIVISION I - SECTION A: Novice Horticultural

The Novice section is open to all who have not won an award or more than three (3) blue ribbons in horticultural classes in an ARS or RERS show. A novice exhibitor may show in any amateur section, but once having won a blue ribbon there, may no longer exhibit as a novice. Once having won "Best Novice", exhibitor must show in "Amateur" class. Please see the Eligibility Chart for your status. All blue-ribbon winners eligible for Best Novice Award.

DIV. I - SECTION E: PHOTOGRAPHY

Classes 38 through 46 are Eligible for ARS Gold, Silver & Bronze Certificates and Queen, King & Princess; Rosettes)

RULES FOR PHOTOGRAPHY

- All photographs must be the work of the exhibitor and must be the work of a single exhibitor.
- Exhibitors may enter no more than (2) photographs in any one class, and no more than a total of (6) photographs in this show. A photograph may not be entered more than once.
- Except for seedlings, rose varieties photographed must be entered under ARS approved exhibition names.
- All photographs are to be mounted (that is, with a backing board of art board or foam core) and may be matted (the art board "frame" that goes on top of the photograph). Non-matted photographs shall be accepted.
- Outside dimensions of the mat are to be no larger than 11" x 14". Orientation may be landscape or portrait.
- Photographs may be no smaller than 5" x 7" and no larger than 8" x 10".
- Completely fill out ARS Mini Entry tags, and then attach to the lower left-hand corner of the mat with a clip furnished by the Show committee.
- If exhibitor grown, write EG on upper right-hand corner of tag.

CLASSES

Class 45	ONE BLOOM - One bloom of any type of rose. Roses designated as "single" (e.g., Single HT, etc.) must be entered in Class 40
Class 46	ONE SPRAY - Two or more blooms, any type of rose
Class 47	FULLY-OPEN BLOOM - One bloom, fully open, stamens must show. Roses classified as "singles" ARE permitted in this class.
Class 48	ROSE ARRANGEMENT - A photo of an arrangement, miniature or standard, following the American Rose Society Guidelines for Judging Rose Arrangements. Arranger's name MUST be indicated.
Class 49	MACRO PHOTOGRAPHY - Photographs should be extreme closeup photos of any part of the rose or rose plant. Color, Black & White, Sepia, or combinations of these are permitted in this class.
Class 50	CREATIVE INTERPRETATION - The photograph should evoke a sense of originality and a new and different way of imagining the rose or roses with the mind's eye. This may include processes used to alter the original image such as colorizing, texturing, dodging, burning, dithering, painting, shadowing, blurring, layering, cloning, filtering, merging, cropping. Color, Black & White, Sepia, or combinations of these are permitted in this class. Photo enhancement software is permitted in this class
Class 51	PUBLIC OR PRIVATE ROSE GARDEN - Photographs should show the use of roses within the structure of a garden, which can be widely variable. Roses should dominate in the photograph, and some layout of the garden should be visible. The name of the public rose garden MUST be listed on the entry tag.

Class 52	ROSE POTPOURRI - A horticulture specimen that does not fit the criteria for classes 1-7. For example, rose hips, foliage, roses with side buds, multiple sprays, seedlings, critters in the garden, portion of a rose bush with companion plants, etc.
Class 53	NOVIC PHOTOGRAPHER AND THE ROSE. This class is open to an exhibitor who has never won a blue ribbon in the photography section of an American Rose Society district national, local society photo show, or the ARS Digital Photography Contest. A photograph of any rose or roses, rose arrangement, rose garden.

DIVISION II ROSE ARRANGEMENTS ROSE ARRANGEMENT RULES

- The RULES OF THE SHOW, in the front of this schedule, also apply to this division.
- Rose arrangements will be judged in accordance with the standards published in the current GUIDELINES FOR JUDGING ROSE ARRANGEMENTS, as follows:
- All roses must be outdoor garden grown and must be of high quality.
- A rose or roses must be the dominant flower in all arrangements.
- The ARS Approved Exhibition Name of all roses in each arrangement must be written on the entry tag.
- "AG" must be written on the entry tag if roses are arranger-grown so that the entry will be eligible for an ARS medal certificate. Note: ARS Medals will be awarded to first place entries with a minimum of 92 points.
- Exhibitors are permitted <u>only one entry per class</u> but may enter as many classes as in which they are eligible or desire. More than one exhibitor from the same garden may enter the same class.
- Accessories are allowed unless stated otherwise in the schedule.
- Flowers other than roses, and dried and/or treated dried plant material are allowed unless prohibited by the schedule.
- A card of intent may be included with an arrangement as an explanation of the arranger's interpretation of the theme or class title unless the schedule specifically forbids it.
- An arrangement incorrectly placed in a class will be judged in the class in which it is placed.
- All entries must be the work of the exhibitor.
- Only the exhibitor may touch or move an arrangement. However, in special circumstances, if all efforts to locate the arranger have failed, the arrangement chairman may carefully move an arrangement.
- For RERS purposes, the large arrangement Sections A F of the show are designed for two categories of arrangers:
- **N NOVICE**. A novice is someone who has not won an award or more than three first place Div. II ribbons in any ARS sanctioned rose show.
- **A AMATEUR**. One who has won four or more first place Div. II ribbons in any ARS sanctioned Rose show.

Infringement of the following rules will result in severe penalty:

- o Painted or dyed fresh plant materials and live creatures are not allowed.
- o Use of plant materials on the state or local conservation list is not permitted.
- o The American flag or flag of any country may not be used in an arrangement or as a decoration in any way.

Disqualification of an arrangement for:

- o Roses not outdoor grown.
- o Use of artificial plant material.

Design	 The design section is divided into 6 equal parts of 5 points each, as seen below. The principles of design are intangible; they are the manner in which we arrange the components to obtain pleasing balance, dominance, contrast, rhythm, proportion, and scale. Plant material is a tangible component of design. It occupies space & has color from reflected light. It has visual line, form, texture & size. 1. Balance: The visual impression of stability & equilibrium. 2. Dominance: The greater force of one element over others. 3. Contrast: Using unlike elements to emphasize difference, such as color, length, texture or contrast, balance, framing, viewpoint, direction of movement and diagonals, where applicable. 4. Rhythm: Suggests motion & leads the eye through the design. It is achieved by repetition of line direction, form & color. 5. Proportion: The amount of plant material in relation to the container; the amount of round forms to angular; the amount of bright colors to dull ones. 6. Scale: Applies to size, such as the size of one flower to another; the size of the flowers to the container; the size of the accessory to the container.
